Registration Guidelines

- Students may register online, by phone, or in person. CAM members enjoy discounted tuition.
- Registration is complete and confirmed when payment is received and processed.
- A full refund will be issued when a withdrawal occurs at least one week prior to the start of a class or workshop.
- Students withdrawing between one week and 72 hours from the start of a class or workshop will be given a 50% refund.
- No refunds or transfers will be issued for withdrawals received less than 72 hours before the start time.
- Students who are not in attendance and have not been in touch with the Museum School office will be charged the full price of the class or workshop.
- If class or workshop does not make minimum enrollment, it will be canceled and enrolled students will receive a 100% refund.
- There is a non-refundable CAM Service charge applied to all transactions. This fee helps to cover the museum's overhead, which allows us to continue to serve our community with high-quality exhibitions, public programs, and educational opportunities in the visual arts.

Museum School at Cameron Art Museum was inspired by a tradition which thrived from 1938-1942 at the Wilmington Museum of Art School. The CAM Museum School offers ongoing, high-level art education from qualified professional instructors, who are also working artists in our community. Much like the first museum school in Wilmington, instruction is offered in the fundamentals as well as in more deeply engaged levels, as students are encouraged to develop skills through continued classes and workshops. Unique to Museum School is the museum collection and ever changing exhibitions accessed as teaching tools in classes and weekend workshops. **Students have access to the museum galleries after their class.**


